# Introduction

- Why bother?
  - Popular demand, and we're user-driven
  - Java has a strong presence on server-side
  - Many really good open-source projects in this field
  - Current deployment of Java is painful
    - Transitive closuritis
    - Interfacebreakitis

# What needs to be done?

- New packages
  - open-source applications
    - sometimes has long dependency chains with loops (e.g. Maven)
  - commercial applications
    - appservers, IDEs, even libs
      - licensing mess, should we bother?
